 - Goals are the Broad statements that target the Issues, support the Vision and make it a reality.
 - Recommendations are specific to each Goal and tell what we should do to accomplish that Goal.

C. LAND USE PLANS

A character description for each Land Use Area.

- There may be no change from the current zoning boundaries, but their purpose may change somewhat. Each zoning district has a "purpose" statement – as an example see the Town of Day Zoning Law beginning on page 4.
